



LEATHER CARE INSTRUCTIONS

Our leather has been manufactured from genuine cattle hide. During its life the animal may be been in contact with barbed wire or the horns of other animals. These encounters may leave scars and scratches that have healed naturally. They do not detract from the wearing qualities of the leather, in fact they enhance its appearance as they are the proof mars of genuine full grain leather. Full grain leather is a natural surface. It is important to note that leather may stretch a little subject to the thickness of the hide and design of the sofa.

Instructions to care for your leather:

Do not dry clean or machine wash.

Do not use detergents, solvents, abrasives, non-recommended leather cleaners or suede cleaners.

Protect from direct sunlight and heat sources, both direct and through heating vents.

If you have marks on your leather surface, they should be removed as soon as possible using leather cleaner.

Vacuum regularly with the soft brush attachment of the vacuum cleaner to remove dust and grit then wipe with a soft, colour-fast cloth dampened with plain water. [This should be done as often as necessary or at least every 2-3 weeks.

Every three or four months a systemic cleaning with the leather cleaning and condition cream is recommended. These products have special additives to nourish your leather and add to its moisture repellence.

In the meantime, if you have marks on your leather surface, they should be removed as soon as possible using leather cleaner.

When cleaning leather do not rub excessively or too hard. Always let the product do the work and adhere to the manufactures instructions. Use only a soft, colour-fast or white cloth or sponge.

Special note:

The salts and body oils which occur naturally in human skin can damage the surface of the leather if left uncleaned for lengthy periods.

In warm or humid weather it is important that leather be wiped over weekly, particularly if the leather has become damp with perspiration or deposits of body oils are visible on areas as head rests.

Always clean along any creases that have developed in the leather and pay particular attention to areas that come in contact with the skin such as head-rests, arm-pads or seat cushions.

Deterioration due to incorrect or inadequate maintenance cannot be considered a fault in the leather.

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
